EXECUTIVE SUMMARY



2016 saw tremendous expansion of The Aeolian's Mission and economic engine. Our revenue stream grew and we launched a number of new programs. One of the most exciting developments was the long-term lease of a new facility, Bishop Cronyn Memorial Place, 442 William St. in London, Ontario. This former church (built in 1873) is a Designated Heritage Site and has offered our organization a chance to grow both its education programs and its production capacities. The former Church has a lovely Sanctuary with wonderful acoustics. It seats approximately 300 people and has a magnificent Casavant Organ, a Portative Baroque Organ, and a fairly new Yamaha Grand Piano. On the north side of the Nave, there is a hidden Chapel which

seats approximately 40 people. Its adjacent complex includes three floors of larger and smaller meeting rooms and three kitchens. It also includes a wing of rooms underneath, attached to a seniors' complex called Warner Place. The primary reason for securing this facility was the pending closure of Lorne Avenue Public School where our El Sistema program operated, and our need to find a new facility for our El Sistema Aeolian Program.

Since securing this facility, the Aeolian has launched two new programs: Rebelheart Collective and Pride Men's Chorus London. The Aeolian also continues to operate Ignite London, Art Shows, a Volunteer Mentorship Program, and an Adult Orchestra, as well as preserve two designated Heritage Sites.

In October of 2015, the Aeolian conducted a fundraiser in order to purchase a new Concert Grand Piano for its stage. Thanks to the generosity of D&S Pianos, the Aeolian was able to purchase a Yamaha CFIII grand piano. This instrument has been extremely well received by artists in our 2016 production year. World-renowned concert pianist Janina Fialkoska remarked that this instrument was the best-sounding piano she played during her national tour.

The Aeolian continues its focus on community building through the arts. We are grateful to all of our volunteers who help us accomplish our Mission. Without our volunteers, the Aeolian would not exist.


BOARD STRATEGY

This will require creative thinking on the part of our staff, volunteers, and Board. We have managed to do great things over recent years. It is time for us to move to the next stage of our development.

SISTEMA AEOLIAN

El Sistema Aeolian is a program run by The Aeolian based on a program founded in Venezuela in 1975. This initiative has grown to include programs in 87 countries and has won TED, UNESCO and Glenn Gould Awards.

It is a free, intensive after-school music program. Aeolian's El Sistema Program was founded in 2011. The program is built on a set of values and parameters and NOT a homogenized curriculum. Each El Sistema program is free to adapt its delivery in a way that is unique to its community, resources and participants.

On April 28th, 2015, the Mayor of the City of London gave El Sistema Aeolian a Pillar Award in recognition for outstanding community impact.

MISSION

GIVING MUSIC TO EVERYONE.

The arts enlighten, inspire and transform individuals, helping us build strong, healthy and vibrant communities. El Sistema Aeolian provides an opportunity for children, youth and their communities to experience a free, intensive, innovative and accessible afterschool music program. We provide expert instruction in a nurturing, safe and inclusive environment, allowing participants to develop their full social and musical potential.





VISION

A WORLD FILLED WITH MUSIC.

We see a world in which all children and youth experience the joy and inspiration of music. The skills they will learn are transferable and include social engagement, inclusiveness, leadership, pursuit of excellence and creative learning styles. These skills and pathways will open new horizons for these young people. They will assist them to achieve their full potential and enrich our communities.

BASIC PRINCIPLES AND VALUES.

- **SOCIAL CHANGE:** The primary focus of the program is social transformation through committed pursuit of the goals of excellence in both music-making and citizenship.
- **ENSEMBLE:** The social learning environment is built around the ensemble and is usually an orchestral and/or choral experience.
- **FREQUENCY:** Ensembles meet multiple times every week for multiple hours over extended periods.
- ACCESSIBILITY: Programs are free, with no financial barrier to enter, are not selective in admission and have an intentional goal of supporting special needs.
- **CONNECTIVITY:** Organizations are linked at the community, regional and national levels, forming a cohesive network of services, resource sharing, collaborative opportunities and advocacy in support of each other.
- **SOCIAL INCLUSION:** Every effort is made to promote social inclusion including the removal of barriers from religion, race, ethnicity, economic or social class, and sexual orientation.

COMMON LEARNING AND PERFORMANCE GUIDELINES.

- **DESIRE AND COMMITMENT:** An El Sistema-inspired program assumes as a basic understanding with students and parents that desire and commitment are necessary for motivation and development. If there is commitment, there is a place for students of all abilities.
- FREQUENCY AND INTENSITY: Frequent practice and playing not only leads to more rapid growth and development of the individual and ensemble but also deepens the relationships within the immersive social learning environment and the performing group. Students meet multiple times every week for multiple hours at a time over extended periods.
- SPONTANEITY AND FLEXIBILITY: The program imposes a less formal, traditional master/student dynamic and allows the program to design itself according to the needs and abilities of each particular group of students.
- THE FUNDAMENTAL ROLE OF AN ENSEMBLE: As a social program, challenges are confronted as a team and solved as a team. The importance of group interaction and mutual support is stressed—students are expected to help and mentor each other. The social aspects of learning, working, mentoring, and performing together are of paramount importance.
- **OWNERSHIP:** Community, parents and students are encouraged to organize and become actively involved in and connected through the program. Each program is defined by and reflects the particular community it serves.

- PEER MENTORSHIP AND LEADERSHIP: The program creates and maintains a "mentor" culture. All participants—teacher, parents, volunteers and the board nurture and support others inside and outside of the program. Leadership abilities are fundamentally tied to a belief in the value of providing service to others through the offering of talents and efforts.
- PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT AND DELIVERY: El Sistema-inspired teaching and learning environments aim to assemble, adapt and test best learned approaches both from the El Sistema global context and other similar global innovative social programs. El Sistema-inspired teachers are constantly fed inspiring learning theories/practices in an incubator-like environment where the teacher's social development lens for participants is always stronger than their music education lens. Every possible effort is made to nurture both the group and the individual thus fostering social inclusion. El Sistema-inspired initiatives collaborate, share information and work towards common regional, provincial, national and international goals.
- CONNECTEDNESS AND CONTINUITY: The culture of excellence in performance, in behavioural conduct, in scholastic achievement, in social relationships and in professionalism are continually and positively reinforced as connected to each other.
- JOY: The joy of creating beautiful music together is reflected as a celebration of life, family and community.

MUSICAL AND SOCIAL GOALS: HOLDING THE TENSION.

The Aeolian's El Sistema Program holds the tension between musical and social goals, trying to achieve a 50/50 balance. On the musical side, the Aeolian offers one of the best music programs available. Its immersive orchestral and choral experiences are foundational pillars. Participants may also apply for a free piano and get free piano lessons. Many workshops and performance opportunities are included in the program.

SOCIAL CURRICULUM

- **PEER MENTORING:** a step-by-step program designed to train youth how to teach and lead ensembles.
- PROFESSIONAL MENTORSHIP: Along with the many workshops presented to benefit El Sistema Aeolian participants, the Aeolian has a new initiative called Rebelheart Collective. Four of Canada's greatest musicians teach senior El Sistema Aeolian Participants on a regular basis throughout the year and collaborate with them in performances.
- INTERGENERATIONAL INTEGRATION: The Aeolian has an adult orchestra with participants who have either studied music or are beginners. Participants in the El Sistema Aeolian Youth program help teach the participants in the adult orchestra. This intergenerational interaction helps the youth develop many social skills. The Aeolian's Senior Choir and Orchestra also collaborates with Pride Men's Chorus London—a choir made up of men from diverse ages and backgrounds.
- **SOCIAL-EMOTIONAL CONNECTION:** Overt presentations are given, helping participants develop Social-Emotional Intelligence.
- 5 MINDFULNESS TRAINING: The participants are trained to practice mindfulness, helping them prepare for classes and performance.
- **SOCIAL FREQUENCY:** Participants participate in workshops and performances that help them gain valuable experience in navigating many social settings.
- **EL SISTEMA AEOLIAN YOUTH CLUB:** Senior participants in the program meet regularly to discuss various issues and subjects affecting their daily lives. Conversations are moderated by an experienced youth leader.
- 8 MEAL TIME: Participants are fed a meal every day and eat together seated at tables with volunteers and teachers. This social time helps build bonds and relationships amongst the participants and the support team.

Portland-based singer/songwriter Matt Alber is currently touring his 4th self-produced studio album entitled, Wind Sand Stars. The album features original pop/folk art songs rooted in melody with vocals reminiscent of Rufus Wainwright, Iron & Wine, and John Grant.

In 2014, the Lincoln Center in New York invited Matt to perform on their albums recorded at George Luca esteemed American Songbook series Skywalker Ranch with the a cappe which garnered a printed review by the New York Times. In 2015, he was

selected by the U.S. State Department as a musical ambassador to Russia, Hungary, Kosovo and to Sudan, Africa, where he taught recording arts & sciences to young artists in Khartoum.

Matt's music has been featured on ABC Family's series "The Fosters" and "Bones" and he appears on two Grammy Award-winning classical albums recorded at George Lucas' Skywalker Ranch with the a cappella men's ensemble Chanticleer.

The concept for the El Sistema Adult Orchestra began in 2013. Mark Tse, a conductor for the El Sistema Aeolian Youth Program, received feedback from volunteer classroom monitors regarding frustrations they were experiencing. They wanted to help the participants in a more meaningful way. Mark suggested that if they could stay after the program sessions, he would volunteer some time to help them learn the basics of playing string instruments.

In 2014, The Aeolian's Executive Director Clark Bryan decided that offering this opportunity fulfilled not only a practical role in the El Sistema Aeolian Youth Program, but also fulfilled many life-long dreams of these volunteers. Many of the volunteers had always wanted to learn how to play a musical instrument and never had a chance to do so. Some volunteers had studied when in their youth but couldn't find an opportunity to join a group to continue their playing. The El Sistema Aeolian Adult Orchestra was founded!

The El Sistema Aeolian Adult Orchestra participants pay a nominal fee to participate in this initiative. Funds raised from this program help sustain El Sistema Aeolian's Youth program.

An unexpected opportunity was provided by this endeavour. Senior participants in the El Sistema Aeolian Youth Program have been helping teach the adults as volunteers. This experience has been enriching for both the youth and the adults on a few levels. The intergenerational relationships that have formed from this are helping build community. The youth are learning communication and teaching skills that will help them for the rest of their lives!

ADULT PROGRAM INFORMATION:

- Instruments offered include Violin, Viola, Cello and Double Bass
- Adult Program participants must supply their own instruments
- Based on the same philosophy as the El Sistema Aeolian Youth Program, namely the achievement of social development through the experience of music-making
- Participants are welcome regardless of background, ability or financial means
- Program subsidies are available in cases of financial hardship
- No previous musical experience is required
- Sessions take place at Bishop Cronyn Memorial Place on Saturday mornings from 10:00 a.m. till noon
- Anyone can apply: ages 17 and up
- Cost: \$10 per two-hour session
- Fees include rehearsal space, instruction and printed materials



88 KEYS TO INSPIRATION

FREE PIANOS FOR OUR COMMUNITY











88 Keys to Inspiration is a collaborative program made possible between D&S Pianos and The Aeolian. Both organizations, and the community members that donate the pianos, believe that every child should have access to a quality education, including a rich arts education. Therefore, The Aeolian and D&S Pianos have joined efforts to form a music community-building program bringing quality donated pianos back to life in new homes with young musicians. 88 Keys to Inspiration is about creating music learning opportunities for individual and community growth through the arts. Pianos are donated through The Aeolian, a registered charity. D&S pianos look after the initial assessment, tuning and delivering of these pianos to the homes of applicant children and their guardians. By providing good quality used pianos to homes of children who cannot afford them, this program fills the gaps between those having access to a quality musical opportunity/education and those who would not otherwise. Recipients benefit by receiving:

- A piano in great condition to serve the student for years of valuable practice. The value of the donated pianos ranges from \$400 to \$5000 D&S Pianos is also donating the following services with each piano donation. The average value of the listed services is between \$500 and \$600:
 - Assessment of piano
 - Move to Aeolian Hall or D&S Pianos location
 - Initial tuning
 - Delivery to recipient's home

88 KEYS TO INSPIRATION

88 Keys to Inspiration recipients can donate the piano back to the program when it is not being used anymore.

Eligibility criteria:

- Homes of children and youth who do not have the financial means to purchase a piano
- Students committed to the El Sistema Aeolian program will be given priority, but must apply too
- Community spaces which are not commercial businesses and aren't supported in a large way by public funding (Religious organizations of all denominations that are registered charities or incorporated not-forprofits will be considered on a case-by-case basis, provided that they offer a music program that benefits the broader community)
- 88 Keys to Inspiration recipients agree to keep the instrument in as good condition as they received it, and understand that regular tune-up and maintenance will need to be scheduled and budgeted for once per year

How to apply:

- Applications can be submitted at any time
- All applications must be received in writing. Applicants will be contacted within 4 weeks after application is received
- Applicant youth/parent/guardian/community organization must describe the reasons why they think a piano would be of benefit to a specific child/community they serve
- Outline the financial reasons why a piano purchase outside of this program isn't possible. Attach any relevant supporting information

Aeolian Hall's Rebelheart Collective is a self-conducted music ensemble rooted in democracy through music. With a focus on collaboration, apprenticeship and community engagement, the Rebelheart Collective transforms the traditional concert-going experience by providing complimentary access to live performances in a socially relaxed setting. At its core, the musicians are highly trained professionals who have chosen to give back to the community, helping to train our next generations of musicians including participants of the El Sistema Aeolian program. The Collective's repertoire includes classical music, contemporary works, and compositions and arrangements that speak to the Canadian music tradition: many of which celebrate our collective local and First Nations history.

VISION

Respecting musical tradition, the Rebelheart Collective envisions a future with vibrant, innovative and accessible performance at Aeolian Hall and among those unique community spaces where people can be uplifted through song. The Rebelheart Collective will be a catalyst for both artistic and social change. While supporting and enhancing both musical performance and education, the Collective will bravely stand up to tradition to ensure that all will be welcome to the concert hall, wherever the performance shall be. The Rebelheart Collective is for all people and will be a symbol of and a pioneer in providing universal access to high quality music presentation and education. Like the Shakespearean audience, those with the least to give shall have the most to gain.

Without their activism to create a country where all can be treated with equality and respect, this initiative would be not be possible. We sing to challenge perceptions of the LGBTQ community. Our goals include combating fear and hatred, encouraging compassion through human connection and inspiring our audiences with the superb quality of our sound. Music helps audiences mourn losses, cheer victories, find unconditional acceptance and celebrate life!

Pride Men's Chorus London is part of a movement of gay choirs in the world. In 1978 San Francisco's Gay Men's Chorus made an unexpected debut after the assassinations of Harvey Milk and George Moscone. The choir sang at City Hall at an impromptu Memorial Service performing Felix Mendelssohn's *Thou, Lord, hast been our refuge*. The movement has grown across the United States, Canada, Europe, England and Australia.

Pride Men's Chorus London was founded in March 2016 by co-founders Clark Bryan and Rod Culham. It made its unexpected debut at The Vigil for The Orlando Massacre hosted at Aeolian Hall on June 14th, 2016. The choir rehearses Sunday evenings 7:30 p.m. at The Aeolian's new Education Campus, Bishop Cronyn Memorial Place. The original choir with approximately 20 members has grown in size. It has given performances at The Arts Project and Aeolian Hall. It has collaborated with Grammy-winning songwriter Matt Alber and The Aeolian's El Sistema Senior Orchestra and Choir.

The choir has male members from the straight, transgendered and gay communities. It sings repertoire from Classical, Broadway, Folk and Pop Genres. The choir ranges in ages from 20's to 70's.

Ignite London is a high-energy evening of five-minute talks by people who have an idea—and the guts to get on stage and share it. Run by Aeolian Hall staff and volunteers, Ignite London is a force for raising the collective IQ and building connections in our city.

These five-minute talks are accompanied by 20 slides. Each slide is displayed for 15 seconds, and slides are automatically advanced.

The subject must be something that will inspire the community and can't be shameless self-promotion or a business activity. These talks are designed to inspire our community and are recorded for posting on YouTube. It is both free to give a talk and free to come and listen. The concept is similar to TED Talks but in a smaller format.

We have offered this free event to our community for a number of years and featured specially-themed Ignite Sessions such as Social Work, Alternative Medicine, Cancer, and Education. The thematic Ignite sessions have often been presented in collaboration with various faculties at Western University.

The Aeolian uses two facilities that are designated Heritage Sites: AEOLIAN HALL AND BISHOP CRONYN MEMORIAL PLACE.

Built in the late nineteenth century, both facilities require work to ensure their futures. The Aeolian Hall Musical Arts Association is proud to be the custodians of these fine pieces of architecture. We keep their stories alive, helping root future generations in our past, teaching them our evolving stories.

PRESERVING HERITAGE

THE AEOLIAN HALL

- Built as the Town Hall for London East
- Construction took place between September 1883 and June 1884
- It is a combination of High Victorian and Italianate design
- Approximately 12,000 square feet in space with the Opera House Hall on the 2nd and 3rd floors
- On December 23, 1915 the London Public Library opened the East End Branch—the first branch location for the library—on the ground floor
- On October 10, 1927 the first convention of the NAACP in Canada was held at The Town Hall
- In 1968, Gordon Jeffery purchased the former London East Town Hall and refurbished it as a fully equipped musical performance center
- In 2004, Clark Bryan bought the Hall and developed it into a music school and arts presentation facility
- In 2009, Mr. Bryan changed the governance of the Hall to a Registered Canadian Charity
- In 2011, Mr. Bryan changed the ownership of the Hall to a Registered Canadian Charity

BISHOP CRONYN MEMORIAL PLACE

- Located at 442 William St. London, Ontario
- Built in 1873 and named after the first Bishop of the Anglican Diocese of Huron, with Gothic Architecture and beautiful stained glass windows
- The second oldest Church in London Ontario
- The complex includes the historic church, a Chapel, three stories of adjacent rooms and an attached wing of rooms under the adjacent seniors centre
- Approximately 12,000 square feet of space
- Now the location of Aeolian's programs: El Sistema Aeolian, Pride Men's Chorus London and The Rebelheart Collective Chamber Orchestra
- Gives us plenty of space to expand our programming in the next 5-10 years including increasing participants in our existing programs

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Citizen Culture: Free tickets are given to newcomers to London for a period of one year from their arrival. The Aeolian releases a number of tickets for this program at select events

El Sistema Aeolian Concerts at Bishop Cronyn Memorial Place: These concerts are 100% free to the public

El Sistema Aeolian Program: An absolutely free program available to the community of London

Doors Open Events: Free tours and artistic presentations at both of the Aeolian's Facilities

Art Show Tours: These are available during regular office hours

Free Workshops: Participants in the Aeolian's Programs are invited to attend free workshops given by groups such as Tafelmusik, Brassroots and other guest performers at The Aeolian

This year, volunteers donated at least 40,000 hours of their combined time to help make the Aeolian and its programs successful. This is the monetary equivalent of \$600,000 at \$15 per hour.




