President's Message



What a difference a year can make! While COVID-19 is still around, the World Health Organization has declared the "Emergency" as being over. Interestingly, despite that declaration, there are still huge numbers of people out there who have only had 2 vaccinations, and people are still getting COVID and the potential complications—e.g., long COVID are not trivial. That said, it has been great to be able to go out to The Aeolian for live performances, to not have to be quite so vigilant, and to be able to actually see the smiles on people's faces now that masking is less necessary.

This past year has been another year of change for The Aeolian organization. One of the biggest changes is we have moved our operations from the Bishop Cronyn Education Campus and commenced a partnership with First-St. Andrew's United Church at the corner of Queen and Waterloo streets. Our El Sistema Aeolian programme is thriving in the new space. We have also had major changes to our Pride Men's Chorus which is now the Aeolian Pride Choruses—upper and lower voices. Our Aeolian Pride Choruses now includes individuals who sing in all the vocal ranges. Our first concert, as the new chorus, was on The Aeolian Stage on 28th May 2023.

Beginning in the summer of 2022 as the "brainchild" of our Executive Director Clark Bryan, the Wednesday evening Pride Socials have been a success that has exceeded our wildest dreams. They provide a venue for a diverse group of individuals from the Queer Community to get together in a safe and welcoming environment to socialize. The evenings started with "Rodway"—sing-along events to Broadway tunes organized by Rod Culham, board games, cards, and just chat. Because of the success and popularity of these nights during the summer, they are now being expanded to Wednesday and Thursday evenings. Individuals in the transgender community have described it as "the only safe spot to socialize in London." Another first for The Aeolian in 2022 was our very successful Jazz Festival. I am pleased to see that this will occur again this summer in an even bigger format with some exceptional performers.

Once again, The Aeolian continues as beacon for diversity in the London community and a shining example of how musical performance and education improve a community. We are only able to do this through the very generous support of our donors, our amazing volunteers, our Community Advisory Council, our Board, and our dedicated staff. Thank you all for continuing to help us bring our vision to reality. Now that we have settled into a more stable home for our El Sistema Aeolian and Pride Chorus programmes, we look forward to launching a capital campaign to raise funds for much needed renovations for the Aeolian Hall itself.

In closing, I want to thank my fellow Board members for their support over the past year. I especially want to thank our Artistic & Executive Director--Clark Bryan and his husband, Bryan Gloyd for the enormous amount of work they continue to do for the organization.



Thanks to the welcoming spirit of Pastor Joshua Lawrence and his community, we are excited to create more partnership in the expansion of the El Sistema Aeolian initiative helping give "The Gift of Music, The Gift of Community" to even more young people.

The pathway ahead is challenging, and we entreat our community to continue to help give "The Gift of Music." UKRAINE BENEFIT

On March 24th, 2022, The Aeolian presented a benefit concert in support of refugees and others trapped by the war in Ukraine. 100% of funds raised at this event were directed to the International Red Cross. The concert featured performances by musicians and artists and included a celebration of Ukrainian art and culture. Guests included international celtic superstar, Loreena McKennitt.



The concert was inspired by efforts to unite peace and common good in the world.

There are many worthy international organizations working to support and stabilize the humanitarian crisis in Ukraine. The Aeolian selected the International Red Cross as an impartial, neutral, and independent organization. The mission of the Red Cross is to protect the lives and dignity of victims of armed conflict and provide them with assistance. The Aeolian raised over \$70,000. According to the International Red Cross, one of the most successful fundraisers in Canada.







BLACK LOVE

When the Canadian League for the Advancement of Colored People met for the first time at London's Aeolian Hall in 1927, the hopeful event committed to advocating against the economic disadvantages faced by young people, specifically joblessness. Nearly 100 years later, unemployment among black people in Canada is nearly 7% higher than the national average. The Aeolian, in collaboration with the W.E.A.N. Community Centre and community partners such as the London Black History Coordinating Committee, the Congress of Black Women of Canada (London Chapter) and the Urban League, revisited the 1927 event and the manifesto that was published as a result of that convention. With an aim to meet annually, this project will serve to measure the progress toward equity and inclusion of the black community in London.

Like the original League convention, the event titled "Black Love" was held at the Aeolian Hall of May 22, 2022 and included a meeting of the black community and its allies, dinner and a music performance. The Aeolian presented the Jason Max Ferdinand Singers from Huntsville, Alabama. The choir, a dream for the two-time Grammy nominated songwriter and conductor, was formed after the Congressional riots of January 6, 2021 to ensure that optimism has a place in speaking out against societal challenges. Much like the League in 1927, the choir is determined to not be bystanders and to let their creative voices be heard.





JAZZ FESTIVAL

Four stages. Five Days. Countless jazz musicians. The Aeolian has a long history of being a destination for jazz music. Legends such as Chick Corea, Fred Hersch, Robi Botos and Dave Young have performed on the Aeolian stage. The Aeolian's First Annual Jazz Festival ranfrom June 15th to June 19th, 2022, the first annual Aeolian Jazz and Musical Arts Festival was an opportunity to celebrate local, regional and national jazz. The Festival ran across four stages: the Aeolian main stage and the Dave Southen Lounge (inside) and the Russell Hendrix-Royal Oak Homes Stage and the Curt Lind Dundas Street Garden (outside).

The Festival featured main stage nationally celebrated artists such as Amanda Tosoff, Emilie-Claire Barlow, Julian Taylor, Payadora and Carol Welsman. Main stage shows were ticketed.

The festival featured as many local groups and individual artists as possible including two Big Bands. These concerts were free to the public.

Aeolian First Annual Song Writing Contest

London Ontario was recently designated a World Music Heritage City by UNESCO. To celebrate, The Aeolian ran a Song Writing Contest to support local songwriters. We asked local song writers to record and submit a song in any genre (country, classical, jazz, popular etc.) with themes of love, beauty, and home.

The contest was designed to offer a platform and showcase for artists to celebrate their creations, gain support through prizes and showcase London as a UNESCO City of Music. It is also a way for our city to celebrate our talented creatives and focus on inspiration during an especially challenging time.

Over 180 submissions were made to the contest. The winners:

First Prize: Tara Dunphy Second Prize: Matt Martin Third Prize: Stephen Ingram

Prizes included cash, recordings, features in concerts and industry brand consultation.

Ty Herndon

On Saturday May 28th, 2022, legendary Country Music Star Ty Herndon performed at The Aeolian. This Grammy Nominated and Dove Award Winning artist spent time rehearsing and collaborating in concert with The El Sistema Aeolian Festival Choir and Pride Men's Chorus. The song he sang with El Sistema Aeolian was entitled Orphans of God. The legendary Broadway singer Kristin Chenoweth saw Ty's post on social media singing with the kids. A friend of Ty's, Kristin said she hoped she would someday be able to sing with the kids too! Ty did an interview with Executive Director, Clark Bryan and talked about his jouney in music and coming to terms with his identity.



Move to First-St. Andrew's

In late December 2022, The Aeolian left its seven-year home at Bishop Cronyn Memorial Place (formerly Church). After failed attempts to purchase the property from the Diocese of Huron (the Diocese was unable to sell, due to legal challenges of severing the facility), The Aeolian moved its Education Campus to First-St. Andrew's United Church. This long-term home for the The Aeolian Pride Choruses, El Sistema Aeolian and other education programs is housed in the second and third stories of the Church Hall. The Aeolian also has access to the larger spaces in the Church during program hours. The Aeolian found similar vision and values in this Church and we have already started collaborative programming with members from its community.





Aeolian Pride Socials

In late June 2022, the Aeolian decided to open its doors to London's 2SLGBTQ+Al Community for a social night held every week on Wednesday evenings. The Executive Director Clark Bryan had heard for years from the Pride Community that there was a lack of safe spaces available in our city where The Pride Community could just socialize. With newly opened Lounges on the main floor of The Aeolian Hall, these spaces began to fill up with members of the 2SLGBTQ+Al Community and their allies.



Aeolian Phoenix Sessions

A few months after the Pandemic, The Aeolian began to produce a series of Virtual Concerts called "The Phoenix Sessions". These concerts included interviews with artists and were available by subscription for a nominal fee of \$20.00 per month. The Aeolian continued to present The Phoenix Sessions in 2022 to help those still uneasy about COVID 19 and risks associated with coming out into public. Thanks to the support of grantors like Ontario Trillium Foundation, Canadian Heritage and Southwest Tourism, The Aeolian was able to install a state-of-the-art recording studio on its main floor with audio and video feeds from Aeolian Hall. This studio continues to serve the music community, with recordings of concerts and albums.



Aeolian Benefit Gala

On December 9th, 2022, The Aeolian presented a Gala Concert to benefit The Aeolian. The Aeolian relies on its community of supporters to fullfill its mission. Highlights included performances by Aeolian's Pride Men's Chorus, El Sistema Aeolian, and Yuri Pool from The McCartney Years. The Aeolian thanks its community musicians for their help to raise needed funding for their programs.

Music Production

One of the most challenging things to define about The Aeolian according to Branders is the question "what's your brand". Branders find it hard to define and distill our brand. For our music production, we do so many different genres of music and other types of presentations. This is our definition: diversity! Something for everyone.... or most everyone.....

Whether it's classical, jazz, singer-songwriter, R&B, World Music, Folk, popular, country, fusion, or experimental, we try to showcase diversity.

Music genre isn't the only way we program. We work hard to program artists from BIPOC and 2SLGBTQ+AI communities as well. Making sure we have as much gender parity as we can is also a reflection of The Aeolian's values.

Another lens we use is the region where artists come from. We program a majority of Canadian artists, balancing out local, regional and national selections. We also program artists from other countries like England, France, South and Central America, The United States and many more international destinations.

This season's production has included names like Ron Sexsmith, William Prince, Basia Bulat, Marc Jordan, Ty Herndon, Julian Taylor, Jason Max Ferdinand Singers, Ben Caplan, The Vienna Boys Choir and so many more!

We are proud to be the favourite venue of many performers like Marc Jordan and Buffy Sainte-Marie. We've hosted celebrities like Chick Corea, The Vienna Boys Choir, The King's Singers, Judy Collins and so many more.



With the goal of combating stereotypes and perceptions, we challenge the heteronormative worldview by inspiring our audience, the Pride community and our broader community through advocacy and music. We celebrate victories won, we mourn lives lost, we find unconditional acceptance, and we celebrate all life in harmony, through our songs.

Vision Statement

We will celebrate those who came before us and whose activism was hard fought. United through song, our voices will be freely heard as we fight for a nation and world where diversity is met with met with acceptance, equality and respect.

In 2022, conversations began to take the foundations of what was then "Pride Men's Chorus London" and form "Aeolian Pride Choruses". The new choruses include all voice types (lower and higher), and make the choir expand its mission to be open to all identities throughout the year. The choir has grown to over 50 members and creates a safe space for those feeling vulnerable out in the world. The choir rehearses on Sunday evenings at First-St. Andrews United Church, home to The Aeolian's Education Campus.



From Clark's Studio



A week after the Pandemic struck in March of 2020, The Aeolian's Executive Director, Clark Bryan, began a project to make daily recordings for Youtube. The recordings were made with the intent to inspire our community during a time of darkness. They were also a way to let our community know that The Aeolian was still alive, and, within months, re-opened all of its programs online. The power of music unites us, and catalyzes our imaginations. It reminds us that creativity is the spark of life!

These recordings survey music in the last four hundred years and often present unknown compositions and composers. Works were chosen to highlight the richness of cultural diversity, gender and ethnicity. Clark recorded 441 piano works in 2022, totalling 113,718 views.

This project continues, and, through it, Clark is happy to continue to give "The Gift of Music, The Gift of Community."

Diversity, Equity and Inclusion

In every move we make, The Aeolian has a lens for Diversity, Equity and Inclusion. We work hard to weave inclusivity into our programs, communications and our community.

Production

We make every attempt to cultivate artistic presentation with BIPOC, 2SLGBTQ, and gender representation. We work to present music from as many genres, cultures and age groups as possible.

Programs

Pride Choruses is a manifestation of our efforts to support the 2SLGBTQ+Al Community and their allies. The choirs have ages from 15 to mid-70's and we pick repertoire that focuses on celebrating diversity and inclusion.

El Sistema Aeolian

El Sistema Aeolian is a free, afterschool music program open to all children and youth ages six to nineteen. The program attracts many participants from newcomer families from many countries in the world.

Pride Socials

The Aeolian opened its doors to the 2SLGBTQ+ Community for weekly Pride Socials! A chance for community members to get together for conversation, drinks, games & more in a safe and inclusive environment.

Aeolian Newsletter

The Aeolian Newsletter has been in magazine format for many years now. Each issue includes celebrated music and culture from Indigenous, Black and 2SLGBTQ+AI Communities. We invite submissions for the newsletter! We also honour and present stories highlighting London's history and important Human Rights Advocacy.







CELEBRATING BLACK VOICES WITH ICONIC MUSIC

Music has always been about shared experiences in life. For any emotion one feels, it's relatively easy to find a corresponding song. The same holds true with society where groups of people share songs to connect on a deeper level.

Preserving Heritage

The Aeolian is proud to house its programs in two Heritage Facilities. We believe in preserving and celebrating our past as a beacon for our shared histories and as a touchstone to our futures.

The Aeolian Performing Arts Centre

Built in 1883-1884 as the Town Hall for London East, The Aeolian has a rich and vibrant history as a community anchor. The site of Fire Station No. 2, the first branch of The London Public Library, a school, The Oddfellows meeting space, the First Convention in Canada of the NAACP and so much more, the Aeolian continues to serve its community as a centre for The Arts and inclusive programming.

Aeolian's Education Campus at First-St. Andrew's United Church

The Aeolian moved its Education Campus to First-St.

Andrew's United Church in late December 2022. Permanently housed in the second and third stories of First-St. Andrew's Church Hall, the campus uses many of the larger Church and Chapel spaces during its program hours. The move to this facility was catalyzed by synergies in values as expressed by its Pastor, Joshua Lawrence to the Aeolian's Executive Director, Clark Bryan. The facility was built in the second half of the 19th century and is a well-recognized site for social justice and inclusion.

Clark Bryan and The Aeolian were featured on the U.S. television program, "Paranormal Night Shift," in October 2020. The documentary followed Clark and the early days after his purchase of The Aeolian. Clark experienced everything from interrupted performances to the sensation of never being alone. "Getting used to the sounds of an old building was one thing... but there were strange things going on."






2022 Expenses
