El Sistema Aeolian Program Overview

- Classes of music instruction and rehearsals will run for a minimum of 1 day/week (1 hour/day) for Beginners, and up to 3 days/week for Advanced students (2.5 hours/day) for 32 weeks during the school year, plus a Summer Camp (optional).
- Instruments provided at no cost to families note there will be a Damage
 Deposit of \$30/instrument which will be refunded when the instrument is
 returned in good condition
- A welcoming and nurturing environment
- Field trips and opportunities to experience music outside the classroom
- Leadership development opportunities
- Strong community and volunteer support
- Access to a free piano through the 88 Keys program (partnership with D&S pianos)
- Food program: As finances allow, the program may provide nutritious snacks and meals including opportunities to learn about food and experience food from different cultures

Concerts and Performance Opportunities

Please note that concerts and public performances will be scheduled outside of the regular program throughout the year. Students will have the opportunity to perform for families, peers and members of the local community. We encourage you to come to these performances and share the wonderful sense of pride, community and accomplishment that they foster in each child. There are some special projects that occur during the year which may include performances with famous Aeolian Guest Artists. Please try to participate fully in these events. We will alert you well in advance to their dates and times.

Parent and Family Volunteer Commitment

El Sistema Aeolian is built on the belief that music can transform lives and strengthen communities. While the program is free for all students, it is only possible through the shared effort of families, staff, and community members. To help sustain and grow the program, we ask each family to contribute 5–10 hours of volunteer time over the course of the year.
Volunteer opportunities are flexible and can be matched to your interests, skills and availability. Examples include:
□ Student check-in and check out
□ Assisting at concerts and student performances (ushering, set-up, take-
down, monitoring)
☐ Helping with fundraising events or community outreach
□ Supporting classroom needs (monitors for the classroom and hallways,
preparing snacks)
□ Administrative help such as copying, filing, or event promotion
□ Facility support (light cleaning, maintenance, or special projects)
Your involvement not only helps the program run smoothly but also shows our students the value of community support and teamwork. Even a small contribution of time makes a big difference in keeping this program vibrant, accessible, and inspiring.

If you are unable to volunteer in person, please let us know—there are always other meaningful ways to contribute. Together, we can ensure that every child has the opportunity to experience the joy and discipline of making music.

Help Support Our Music Program

At the Aeolian, we believe music has the power to change lives—not only for the children who learn it, but also for the communities in which they live.

Your child is part of this circle of young musicians, learning not just music, but teamwork, empathy, and community spirit.

Program Policies

ATTENDANCE:

It is essential that program participants participate regularly in all program activities, including rehearsals, concerts, and outside opportunities that enrich the program experience. Participation is important for the musical and personal growth of your child, as well as the impact on their group.

We want to ensure that families are taking our free program seriously and understand that there are consequences for not complying with our Attendance requirements. We understand that parents have changes to their work schedule or are taking courses. ESA still needs to hear from you and provide a reason for your child's absence.

Our Policy:

- 1. We require 80% attendance in our program.
- 2. For every absence, parents must communicate with the El Sistema Aeolian office either by email (elsistema@aeolianhall.ca) or by phone (519) 679-2220 X 200 (ESA office) and provide a reason for your child's absence.
- 3. Senior students (Grade 10 and higher): attend 2 of 3 days per week, 1 day can be optional (not 50% attendance).

Parents must notify the ESA office about expected absences if they occur regularly on certain days for senior students. Leadership class: students or parents must notify ESA when their children do not attend Leadership class.

Legitimate Absences include Medical Appointment, Illness, Family reason, School exams, Work-related or Transportation issues.

Non-Legitimate Absences

1. If you plan to travel this year (vacation or otherwise) and your child will miss 1 month of classes during our programming time, please re-apply to El Sistema the following year. 2. If your child will regularly miss 1/3 of our classes and they are not a Senior Student (Grade 10 and up), then should not continue in our program.

Attendance will be periodically evaluated after each concert or program session. Families that have not been able to fulfill the attendance requirement, or who have missed important events will be invited to a meeting with the program coordinator/teacher to discuss participation and attendance strategies.

Participants will be given an opportunity to improve attendance, and program staff will work with families as much as possible.

If, after another concert or program session, attendance commitment is not consistent, we will discuss the student's place in the program and assess their spot in the program.

CODE OF CONDUCT:

All participants and their parents/guardians agree to abide by the ESA Code of Conduct. The code of Conduct policy is posted on the website.

DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP POLICY

El Sistema Aeolian sessions take place at the El Sistema Education Campus (First St. Andrews Church at 350 Queens Avenue, London ON). Participants and their parents/guardians are responsible for their own transportation to and from the venue. Parents or guardians are responsible for ensuring their child/children are checked in and out of the building and that they come to the door so that the staff/volunteers know they are releasing the children to the correct person and that no child is left behind.

Parents/Guardians shall ensure that the child is picked up from the designated entrance of the venue at the scheduled times. If the named person cannot pick up the child, the program team needs to be informed, in advance, of the name of the person picking up the child. If parents are consistently unable to pick up their children in a timely manner, their place in the program may be reevaluated.

EMAIL POLICY:

El Sistema participants who are in Grade 9 or in a higher grade are allowed to email their ESA teachers directly only with written parental consent and parent must be copied in all communications.

HEALTH ISSUES AND EMERGENCIES:

If a child has a medical condition or a major health issue that requires the use of a puffer or EpiPen, the parent/guardian is required to supply with us such a device to be stored on site for any such emergency as well as to provide training to the Program Coordinator on the use of the device to allow them to assist the child if necessary. In case of an event or a report of an event that we consider posing a serious risk to a participant's health, El Sistema Aeolian staff will take steps to ensure the child receives appropriate professional care (by calling 911 or taking the child to the hospital).

LEAVING THE PREMISES WITHOUT PARENTAL NOTIFICATION:

If a child leaves the hall during a scheduled rehearsal/lesson, the Aeolian team will inform the parent(s)/guardian immediately to ensure the child hasn't been picked up without prior notice and then, if necessary, inform the police who in turn may issue a missing child alert, as this is considered an emergency.

DIVERSITY AND NON-DISCRIMINATION POLICY:

El Sistema Aeolian welcomes participants of any race, religion, nationality, ethnic origin musical ability, and social background to the music education program and related activities.

As a program run by Aeolian Hall, we at El Sistema Aeolian expect and believe that everyone should be treated with dignity and equity, including the 2SLGBTQIA+ community. Discrimination is at odds with our values.

TEAMWORK AND SUPPORT:

El Sistema Aeolian program is designed to develop leadership skills, cooperation, and teamwork. A positive and supportive attitude is expected from your child towards the program, peer participants, volunteers and teachers.

MUSICAL INSTRUMENTS:

El Sistema Aeolian's musical instruments are available free of charge to El Sistema Aeolian participants who need them to take part in the program's activities. There will be a \$30 damage deposit which will be refunded when the instrument is returned in good condition. El Sistema Aeolian participants and their parents/guardian agree to necessary cautions to take care of the instrument and to comply with the Instrument Loan Contract.

Parents are encouraged, whenever possible, to assist with the maintenance of instruments. Accessories such as rosin and strings can be purchased cheaply and help the program with costs.

FOOD POLICY:

All food brought to the program has to comply with Health and Safety regulations. If you want to send food with your child to be shared, please contact

the Program Coordinator in advance so that we can beware of any food allergies.

QUESTIONS & CONCERNS:

The healthy and holistic development of your child is very important to us. If you have any concerns regarding the pedagogy, challenges that your child might be facing with other participants, or any other matter, please contact the El Sistema Aeolian Executive Director or the Program Coordinator.

COVID-19 & Other Illnesses

The Aeolian takes the safety of its patrons, volunteers, and staff very seriously. We will enforce all government regulations regarding COVD-19, as well as other policies we consider to be best practice. If students experience acute symptoms of COVID-19 or other illnesses, we ask that they stay at home. If they are recovering with mild symptoms, we ask that they wear a mask at El Sistema. If you or your child or family member residing or visiting with you develops a communicable illness, we need to know immediately so that we can take the necessary precautions. We expect cooperation with families and participants for all of our health and general safety protocols. Should you be unable to comply or have concerns about this policy we ask that you immediately contact the program coordinator.
