El Sistema Aeolian Program Overview

- Minimum of 4, and up to 6 days (9+ hours) of music instruction and rehearsals per week,
32 weeks during the school year, plus a summer camp.
- Instruments provided at no cost to families
- A welcoming and nurturing environment
- Field trips and opportunities to experience music outside the classroom
- Leadership development opportunities
- Strong community and volunteer support
- Access to a free piano through the 88 Keys program (partnership with D&S pianos)
- Food program: Providing snacks and meals including opportunities to learn about food and experience food from different cultures

Concerts and Performance Opportunities

Please note that concerts and public performances will be scheduled outside of the regular program throughout the year. Students will have the opportunity to perform for families, peers and members of the local community. We encourage you to come to these performances and share the wonderful sense of pride, community and accomplishment that they foster in each child. Program Policies

ATTENDANCE:

It is essential that program participants participate regularly in all program activities, including rehearsals, concerts, and outside opportunities that enrich the program experience. Participation is important for the musical and personal growth of your child, as well as the impact on their group.

As there is high demand for the program, with a waiting list, we expect an 80% attendance rate for participants to remain engaged with the program. Attendance will be periodically evaluated after each concert or program session. Families that have not been able to fulfill the attendance requirement, or who have missed important events will be invited to a meeting with the program coordinator/teacher to discuss participation and attendance strategies. Participants will be given an opportunity to improve attendance, and program staff will work with families as much as possible.

If, after another concert or program session, attendance commitment is not able to met, we will discuss the student's place in the program, and assess their spot in the program.

ABSENCES:

We understand that sometimes there are family emergencies and children do get sick. If this is the case, please contact the program coordinator by emailing us at: elsistema@aeolianhall.ca as soon as possible to notify us of your child's absence. Unjustified late arrivals will count as absences.

CODE OF CONDUCT:

All participants and their parents/guardians agree to abide by the ESA Code of Conduct.

DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP POLICY

El Sistema Aeolian sessions take place at the El Sistema Education Campus (442 William Street, London ON). Participants and their parents/guardians are responsible for their own transportation to and from the venue.

Parents/Guardians shall ensure that the child is picked up from the designated entrance of the venue at the scheduled times. If the named person cannot pick up the child, the program team needs to be informed, in advance, with the name of the person picking up the child. If parents are consistently unable to pick up their children in a timely manner, their place in the program may be reevaluated.

EMAIL POLICY:

El Sistema participants who are in Grade 9 or in a higher grade are allowed to email their ESA teachers directly only with written parental consent and parent must be copied in all communications.

HEALTH ISSUES AND EMERGENCIES:

If a child has a medical condition or a major health issue that requires the use of a puffer or EpiPen, the parent/guardian is required to supply with us such a device to be stored on site for any such emergency as well as to provide training to the Program Coordinators on the use of the device to allow them to assist the child if necessary.

In case of an event or a report of an event that we consider posing a serious risk to a participant's health, El Sistema Aeolian staff will take steps to ensure the child receives appropriate professional care (by calling 911 or taking the child to the hospital).

LEAVING THE PREMISES WITHOUT PARENTAL NOTIFICATION:

If a child leaves the hall during a scheduled rehearsal/lesson, the Aeolian team will inform the police who in turn may issue a missing child alert, as this is considered an escape.

DIVERSITY AND NON-DISCRIMINATION POLICY: El Sistema Aeolian welcomes participants of any race, religion, nationality, ethnic origin, musical ability, and social background to the music education program and related activities.

TEAMWORK AND SUPPORT:

El Sistema Aeolian program is designed to develop leadership skills, cooperation, and teamwork. A positive and supportive attitude is expected from your child towards the program, peer participants, volunteers and teachers.

MUSICAL INSTRUMENTS:

El Sistema Aeolian's musical instruments are available free of charge to El Sistema Aeolian participants who need them to take part in the program's activities. El Sistema Aeolian participants and their parents/guardians agree to use all necessary cautions to take care of the instrument and to comply with the Instrument Loan Contract.

Parents are encouraged, whenever possible, to assist with the maintenance of instruments. Accessories such as rosin and strings can be purchased cheaply, and help the program with costs.

FOOD POLICY:

All food brought to the program has to comply with Health and Safety regulations. If you want to send food with your child to be shared, please contact the Program Coordinator in advance so that we can beware of any food allergies.

VOLUNTEERING:

We greatly appreciate your support to the program. There are many volunteer opportunities! These include: monitors for the classroom and hallways, help in the office, help with the venue with cleaning and organizing, helping during concerts and special events and even help with music education if you have the background. Please contact the Program Coordinator.

QUESTIONS & CONCERNS:

The healthy and holistic development of your child is very important to us. If you have any concerns regarding the pedagogy, challenges that your child might be facing with other participants, or any other matter, please contact the El Sistema Aeolian Executive Director or the program Coordinator.
